NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

The mail and parcel boxes are the property of the U.S. Postal Service and loaned to us as a safety factor for the route delivery personnel and as a convenience to us for the delivery of our mail.

Should a person destroy any mail box that contains mail, the matter becomes much more serious as First Class Mail is handled as a Federal Service, therefore, tampering with the mail becomes a Federal offense.

Malvern has come to the point where it is absolutely necessary to rebuild and hard surface Covered Bridge Drive from Lot 205 around Liberty Lane to its junction with Covered Bridge Road at Lot #166. We have received an estimate for the work and have decided to go to the Membership for the money, approximately \$62,000.

As many of you will remember from our experience of paying for the bridge, it is a lot better to borrow from the Membership than to go to a bank. It gives Members an opportunity to invest in Malvern and will also provide a return on the investment. Interest would be paid every six months and the note will include a prepayment option after two years. Denominations will be available from \$1,000 to \$5,000 payable over four years at 7% interest per annum.

MARCH-APRIL GARDENING TIPS

Lawn Seeding:

March is the ideal time for seeding temperate climate grasses such as blue grass and fescue. It is best to lime and fertilize prior to seeding. Soils in Malvern are quite acid and invariably, lime is needed. To determine how much lime is needed, have the soil tested

Lawn Care:

To get maximum value out of your fertilizer, apply limited amounts in four equal applications - March or early April, Memorial Day, Labor Day and Halloween. This makes the fertilizer available at critical times for the grass and reduces run-off and possible environmental pollution. Lawns adjacent to Lake Malvern and any streams should have the fertilizer applications increased in number and amounts decreased proportionately. Use three (3) applications in Spring, beginning on or before April 1 on a six week interval, and three (3) more in the fall, beginning Labor Day, also on a six week interval.

Pruning Trees:

Check trees for broken branches and remove them now. Cut them back to the fork. The cut should be made at the bulge in the bark at the fork. The bulge in the bark when left, will heal over the cut.
